Apprenticeship checklist for Governors



This quick checklist will help governing bodies to develop their role in advising head teachers and senior leadership teams on the strategy for careers guidance in their schools, specifically in relation to apprenticeships.

The government has committed to supporting 3 million new apprenticeships by 2020. The creation of so many job opportunities coupled with the introduction of new degree apprenticeships will mean that young people will have more options available to them than ever before. It is important that all schools give equal access to all students about the post-16 and post-18 options, including apprenticeships, so that they and their families can make informed decisions about their future and feel well prepared for the next stage of their life.

We have put together a suggested list of 20 questions to raise at your next governing body meeting so that you can self-assess how well you are fulfilling your statutory duties regarding careers and inspiration guidance.
