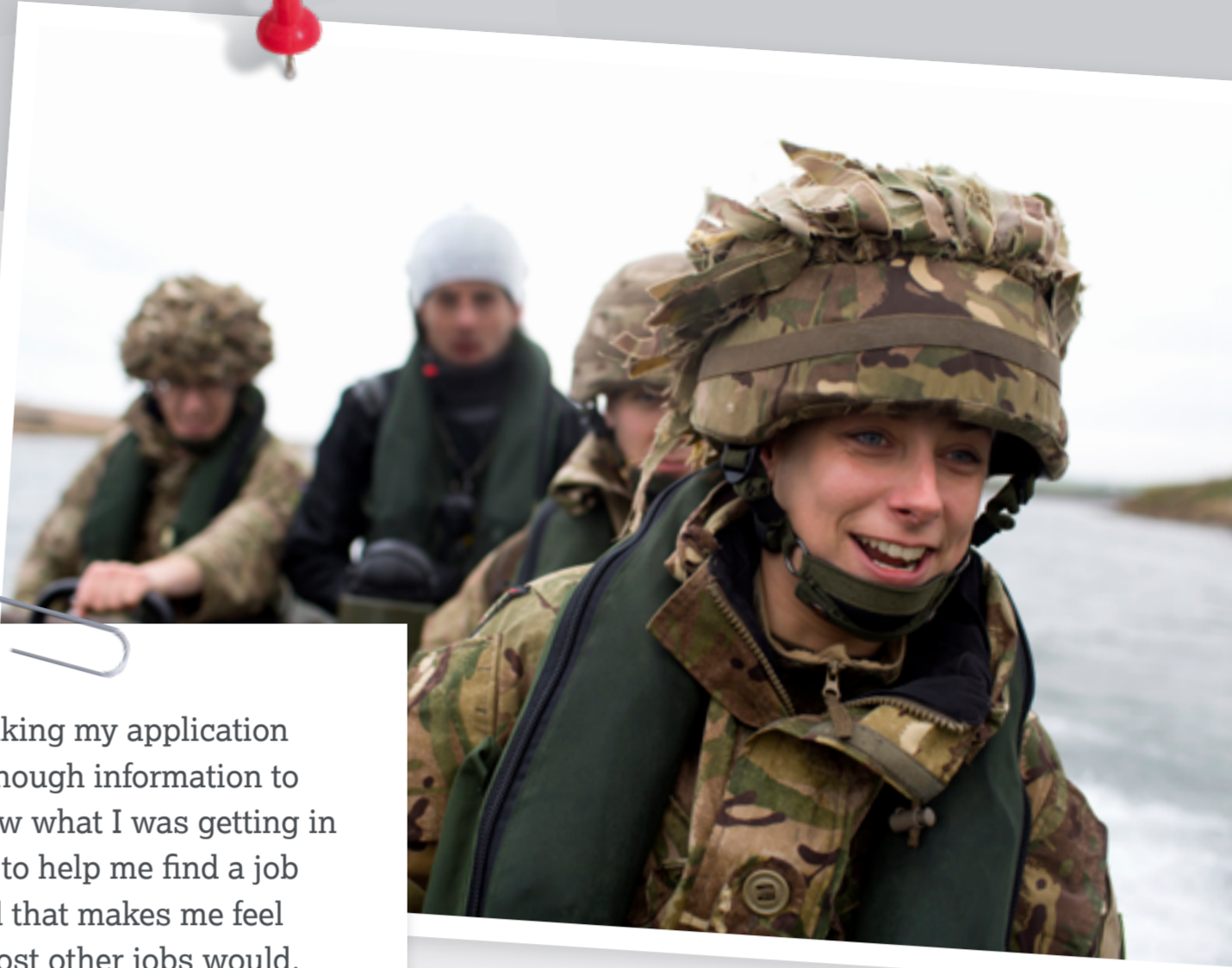


JOIN THE BRITISH ARMY



ROADMAP TO BECOMING A REGULAR **FULL-TIME** SOLDIER

1. ELIGIBILITY

REGISTER & APPLY.

apply.army.mod.uk

You will be asked about yourself, e.g. nationality and age. You'll be told if you can join and what types of role are open to you.

I felt that the people taking my application were able to provide enough information to help me feel that I knew what I was getting in to. They took the time to help me find a job that would fit me - and that makes me feel more welcome than most other jobs would.

Online Candidate Portal:

Submit your application and follow its progress online.

Additional Questions:

You'll be asked more questions, including medical ones.

2. ARMY INTRO

YOUR ARMY BRIEFING.

You'll be invited along to your local careers centre, or to a virtual session, to find out more about the Army, and for us to get to know you better. You'll take away a plan to get ready for the Army Assessment Centre.

Army Careers Centres:

Questions about Army life? Is it right for you? Talk to our recruiters any time.

Information Sessions:

Take advantage of drop-in sessions on different topics, including:

- Information and advice about the assessment
- Centre tests
- Fitness support sessions
- Junior Entry or Basic Training

You can also use the **100% ArmyFit app** to help you prepare.

One-to-One Guidance:

A local recruiter will get to know you and look after you, and can offer advice as you progress.

During your stay, the assessment will include:

- A full medical examination
- Physical and mental tests
- A career discussion

3. ASSESSMENT

ASSESSMENT CENTRE.

Your assessment will be across two days at one of our Assessment Centres. We will pay for travel there and back. This is your chance to get a taste of Army life and for us to see if you have the potential to join!

4. AFTER ASSESSMENT

Once you're through assessment, there's just some final paperwork to do before you're ready to begin your basic training.

- We will check your references and run a background check.* If all looks OK we will send you an offer of employment.
- When you accept the offer, you'll be given your date to start your training and formally join (enlist) in the Army. How quickly you can start will depend on the job you've applied to do, and the grade you were given at assessment.
