

What is GESDAP?

The **Government Economic Service Degree Apprenticeship Programme** is the first degree-level economics apprenticeship in the UK.

A Unique Opportunity

The programme offers
you a unique 4-year
opportunity to work in a
central government
department or agency on
some of the
most important social,
environmental and
economic issues our
country faces – whilst
studying for a degree in
economics.

Study at the University of Kent

You will complete your studies with the University of Kent over 4 years— selected to deliver the programme because of the strength of their economics courses and the support they will offer to apprentices throughout your time on the programme.

A Fully Funded Degree

Your level 6 apprenticeship will be funded by the department or agency you are placed in, via the apprenticeship levy. This means you will not have to pay any tuition fees for your degree!

Permanent Job Offer

If you successfully complete your apprenticeship with a 2:1 or above, you will be offered a permanent position in the GES, earning a minimum of £27,000.










What is an Apprentice Economist?











What will I learn?

You will get first-hand experience of how government works and how policies are made. 80% of your time will be spent working, while the remaining 20% is dedicated to studying.

Working as a member of the GES involves the development and use of:

- Quantitative skills: manipulating and presenting data
- Writing and presentation techniques: communicating economics clearly and succinctly to senior officials and ministers
- Applied economics skills: using economic insights toinform decisions on anything from the environment to transport



The degree in Economics will be comprised of:

- Microeconomics: how individuals and firms make decisions, interaction of supply and demand
- Macroeconomics: how the economy works at a national and international level
- Econometrics: the use of data to test theories and evaluate changes in government policies













- Have a minimum of five GCSE (including Maths at grade B (Level 6) or above and English Language at C (Level 4) or above. Or equivalent
- Have or expect to a gain a minimum of 96 UCAS points under the 2017 tariff point system (e.g., CCC at A
 Level or equivalent qualifications, not including General Studies. Click here for the UCAS Tariff Calculator.

• Eligibility requirements:

- You need to have the right to work in the UK.
- Resided in the UK for at least the previous 3 years before the start of the apprenticeship.
- Meet the Civil Service Nationality Rules.
- We do not offer sponsorship for this programme.

Application FAQs

- Question: I have previously applied for last year's apprenticeship scheme and I wasn't successful can I apply?
 - **Answer:** Yes, if you have applied in a previous year, you can apply again. It's not unusual to succeed after 2 or 3 attempts. However, you can only apply once in each recruitment campaign. Information from previous applications will not be available to assessors.
- Question: Is security clearance required?
 - **Answer:** Yes. If successful you must hold, or be willing to obtain, security clearance to CTC/SC/DV level. Certain departments require a 3-year footprint in the UK. More information about the vetting process can be found <u>here</u>.
- Question: I am currently doing an apprenticeship, can I apply?
 - Answer: Yes, but you will need to finish your EPA and have your grade by the GESDAP start date in Sept 23.

Question: I am a current Civil Servant, can I apply?

- **Answer:** Of course, as long as you meet the entry requirements!











Application FAQs (continued)

- Question: Can I choose which department I will work for?
 - **Answer:** We take into account your location preferences when assigning you to a department, but we cannot guarantee that you will get your choice of location/department..
- Question: Can I apply if I already have a degree?
 - Answer: Yes, as long as the degree is not in economics.
- Question: Why has someone received their online test results before me?
 - Answer: Some tests are staggered to give the recruitment team time to review the scores. Don't worry, the latest you'll hear about your results will be mid-February and you'll be given plenty of time to take the next parts of the assessment process.

How to apply

Registration

To begin your application, you'll need to apply on Civil Service Jobs.

Online Tests

You may be required to complete three online tests: verbal, situational judgement and numerical tests. You will move from one test to the other only if you meet the minimum requirement at the completion of each stage. You will need access to a laptop/desktop computer.

Personal Statement

If you have met the minimum requirements of the online tests, you will be invited to complete a personal statement of no more than 1000 words.

Your statement should include the following:

- Why you are interested in the apprenticeship;
- How you are planning to balance work and study;
- How you are planning to keep yourself motivated and keep track of your performance.

If you are successful at both the online tests and the personal statement sift, you will receive an outcome by February to March 2023 and will be invited to the assessment centre.

Two-stage Assessment Centre

As part of the virtual assessment centre, we will evaluate your suitability for the job in two sections through a combination of tasks and activities. Initially, you will undertake a written exercise and following this you will be invited to complete a presentation and interview.

Assessment Centre Be yourself, smile. Make sure your personality shines through.




