HOW CAN I USE IT TO ENGAGE MY STUDENTS?

Use the ideas below for inspiration on a variety of ways you can use the listing in one of your lessons...





...select a role, research it, and present it to the class (or make a video).

What are the main features of this role that should be shared? You could give them some ideas of what to include in the presentation, or leave it to them to decide the most important elements.



...select a role, research it, create a job interview script and perform it for the class.

What do they think are the types of questions that the interviewer would ask, and what would some of their exemplar responses include? You could give them some question ideas to get them started.



...select the role they are most interested in and tailor their CV as if they were applying for the position.

...select the role they are most interested in and write a covering letter as if they're applying for the position.

Researching and creating a covering letter can be a great way to focus on the detail of the advert and encourage students to identify the key points that they would make to promote themselves.



...select the role they are most interested in and look at the job advert/specification.

Ask students to consider what they could say for each element. If they feel they can't meet any part of it, ask them to think about what they could they do over the next 6-12 months to try and meet all the elements.
