 - Did anything surprise you?
 - Would they apply for any of the apprenticeships?



Research apprenticeships in industries that have traditionally been seen as 'for men'/male dominated

Can your students find out:

- What these industries are doing to recruit and retain female apprentices?
e.g. The FA runs a Women's Football Apprenticeship programme, designed to increase female participation in football.
