What is National Apprenticeship Week?

National Apprenticeship Week (NAW) is the biggest week in the apprenticeships' calendar!

It is an annual, week-long celebration of apprenticeships and everyone involved with them. The week brings together the entire apprenticeship community to celebrate the value, benefit and opportunity that apprenticeships bring.

Key facts about the week:

- 2025 will be the 18th National Apprenticeship Week, having originally started in 2007.
- The week runs from Monday 10th Sunday 16th February 2025.
- It includes thousands of activities and events, both in person and online, across England.
- There will be a huge media presence, with interviews and news articles throughout the week.
- Each year, the week has a theme. This year it is 'Skills For Life'.
- The Department for Education has also released a series of toolkits:

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EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

There will be a large number of events happening In the weeks leading up to National Apprenticeship Week, and throughout the week itself. They are free of charge to attend and cover a variety of topics.

NATIONAL EVENTS CALENDAR

ONLINE EVENTS

There are lots of online events you could participate in at your school/college, or share with students and parents/carers. Find out what national and local employers, training providers (independent providers, as well as colleges and universities) and careers organisations are doing by looking at their websites and social media.

THE BIG ASSEMBLY - ONLINE BROADCAST

The Big Assembly is a live event that can be joined live, or watched later on catch up. The Big Assembly enables students to learn about apprenticeships from a variety of different perspectives, including former and current apprentices, employers of apprentices, parents, education providers, and much more. <u>bigassembly.org</u>

YOUR EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES

If you are running any events or activities that external students and parents or carers could attend, such as an Apprenticeship Fair, publicise it widely. Contact your Careers Hub to see if they could notify other schools, and don't forget to add it to the national events calendar (see above).



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SOURCING SPEAKERS

Hearing from current and former apprentices, and apprentice employers is a brilliant way to engage potential apprentices. Here are some ideas for sourcing inspirational speakers.

SOURCING SPEAKERS

There are a variety of ways you could source current or former apprentices and apprentice employers to speak to your students.

YOUR NETWORKS

- Contact former students who you know are now apprentices and invite them to come back to share their apprenticeship story.
- Reach out to your school or college Enterprise Adviser, who may be able to help or could signpost you to other local employers.
- Reach out to your staff, governor and parent/carer community and ask if they know, employ or work with any apprentices.
- Ask your current year 12 and 13 students if they have any friends who are apprentices.
- Post your request in local online groups such as Facebook and LinkedIn to see if there are any apprentices or apprentice employers in the area who would be willing to join you.
- Share on your social media that you are looking for speakers.
- Contact local colleges who are apprenticeship training providers and ask if they have any students who are doing apprenticeships, or work with any apprentice employers.
- Contact your local Careers Hub.
- Contact local employers who you know employ apprentices.



APPRENTICESHIP AMBASSADORS

In each region there is an Apprenticeship Ambassador network of apprentices and employers who may be willing to come out and support your school or college.

You can submit a request through the ASK programme for a member of the Apprentice Ambassador Network. to support your event.

SOURCING SPEAKERS

PREPARING YOUR SPEAKERS

Once you have secured a speaker, make sure in advance of the session that you have communicated all of the required information about the event and how it will run, including the following:

- The date, time, duration and location of the session, and if they should arrive early to set up before the students join the session.
- How many students they will be presenting to, and any additional needs of the group that may need to be considered.
- Where they can park, if you have reserved parking for them and where they should report to e.g. reception.
- The name and telephone number of the contact person on the day.
- To send in advance any slides they want to use and to let you know if they will need sound or internet access for their presentation.
- You reassure them there will be staff on hand supervising the students and to support with any IT requirements.
- You know if they have any dietary requirements so you can offer them refreshments.

PREPARING YOUR STUDENTS

It can be beneficial to help students to prepare ahead of any external speakers coming in. This could be through an assembly briefing, form/tutor session, or could be a more formal piece of home learning. Encouraging students to learn about the speaker in advance, to undertake some research by visiting their website and to think about preparing their own questions can work well.

BUILDING A RELATIONSHIP

If you'd like your speaker to come in again, make sure you ask them if you can keep in touch about future events, then contact them on an appropriately regular basis to thank them again, and keep them updated on future events and any apprenticeship successes following their session.

You could also ask them to:

- Attend careers fairs.
- Offer work experience.
- Attend parent/carer career events.
- Feature in careers newsletters.
- Sponsor an event or maybe even a student award or experience.
- Put you in touch with other employers.

HOSTING A PARENTS/CARERS EVENT - A CHECKLIST

Use this quick checklist if you are considering hosting an apprenticeships event for parents and carers in your school or college.

Check the school diary and select an appropriate date and time.
Book the hall or another suitable space.
Approach guest speakers. For example this could include; local employers, past-
students who are now apprentices, local experts, your school/college Enterprise Adviser.
Add the event to your school calendar and set up a registration/booking system if
needed.
Invite key staff, including the Senior Leadership Team.
Invite your parents/carers. For example this could include; adding it to your website,
arranging for messages to go out via social media and/or Parentmail, including it within
newsletters, sending out personal invitations, alerting students through
assemblies/tutorials.
Consider which of the free resources you could print or send out in advance.
Make arrangements for refreshments.
Liaise with your IT team about the equipment required.
Arrange for presentations or a recording to be made available afterwards.
Evaluate the success - formally or informally - and record the impact of the event.

TAKE A SUBJECT-LED APPROACH
